



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Gregory , South Dakota [46053]

Gregory is one of 66 counties in South Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 4,595 ranked 37th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Gregory had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,065. This PCPI ranked 28th in the state and was 97 percent of the state average, \$26,927, and 85 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 17.9 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.7 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Gregory was \$14,765 and ranked 43rd in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Gregory had a total personal income (TPI) of \$119,770*. This TPI ranked 36th in the state and accounted for 0.6 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Gregory was \$77,887* and ranked 36th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 13.8 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Gregory. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 49.4 percent of TPI (compared with 51.0 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 31.1 percent (compared with 28.7 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.5 percent (compared with 20.3 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 14.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 18.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.4 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Gregory increased from \$55,177* in 2000 to \$63,602* in 2001, an increase of 15.3 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.4 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$42,607* to the 2001 estimate was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
