



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Tyler (MSA) [46340]**

Tyler is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2001 population of 177,488 ranked 212th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Tyler had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,883. This PCPI ranked 138th in the United States and was 91 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.6 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Tyler was \$17,744 and ranked 163rd in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Tyler had a total personal income (TPI) of \$4,948,851\*. This TPI ranked 199th in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Tyler was \$2,727,408\* and ranked 206th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 0.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tyler. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 64.7 percent of TPI (compared with 62.6 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.2 percent (compared with 23.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.1 percent (compared with 14.0 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 0.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.9 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 6.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Tyler decreased from \$3,847,208\* in 2000 to \$3,841,925\* in 2001, a decrease of 0.1 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$2,010,647\* to the 2001 estimate was 6.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
