



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Baylor , Texas [48023]**

Baylor is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 3,941 ranked 211th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Baylor had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$21,285. This PCPI ranked 156th in the state and was 73 percent of the state average, \$29,045, and 70 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.9 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Baylor was \$15,539 and ranked 92nd in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Baylor had a total personal income (TPI) of \$83,885\*. This TPI ranked 215th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Baylor was \$66,274\* and ranked 206th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 2.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.1 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Baylor. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 46.3 percent of TPI (compared with 46.2 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 24.3 percent (compared with 28.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 29.4 percent (compared with 25.4 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 0.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 2.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 0.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.9 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Baylor increased from \$37,725\* in 2000 to \$37,932\* in 2001, an increase of 0.5 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$32,659\* to the 2001 estimate was 1.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
