



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Wasatch , Utah [49051]

Wasatch is one of 29 counties in Utah. It is part of the Heber, UT Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 16,091 ranked 15th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Wasatch had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$21,835. This PCPI ranked 10th in the state and was 88 percent of the state average, \$24,702, and 71 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.8 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.5 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Wasatch was \$13,687 and ranked 12th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Wasatch had a total personal income (TPI) of \$351,344*. This TPI ranked 14th in the state and accounted for 0.6 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Wasatch was \$143,547* and ranked 17th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 9.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 9.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Wasatch. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 69.4 percent of TPI (compared with 69.3 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.1 percent (compared with 17.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 10.5 percent (compared with 13.4 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 9.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 9.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 11.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.8 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Wasatch increased from \$152,123* in 2000 to \$170,320* in 2001, an increase of 12.0 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$62,928* to the 2001 estimate was 10.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.7 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
