



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Wisconsin [55000]**

The population of Wisconsin in 2001 was 5,408,061. Its rank was 18th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Wisconsin had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$29,380. This PCPI ranked 20th in the United States and was 96 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.8 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Wisconsin was \$18,557 and ranked 24th in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Wisconsin had a total personal income (TPI) of \$158,888,404\*. This TPI ranked 18th in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Wisconsin was \$92,123,964\* and ranked 18th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 3.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Wisconsin. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 68.1 percent of TPI (compared with 66.8 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.4 percent (compared with 19.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.5 percent (compared with 13.8 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 3.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 1.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.6 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 5.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Wisconsin increased from \$114,900,418\* in 2000 to \$118,830,012\* in 2001, an increase of 3.4 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$68,049,087\* to the 2001 estimate was 5.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
