



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Hot Springs , Wyoming [56017]

Hot Springs is one of 23 counties in Wyoming. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 4,754 ranked 22nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Hot Springs had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,551. This PCPI ranked 16th in the state and was 87 percent of the state average, \$30,374, and 87 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 13.0 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.7 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Hot Springs was \$17,538 and ranked 14th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Hot Springs had a total personal income (TPI) of \$126,223*. This TPI ranked 22nd in the state and accounted for 0.8 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Hot Springs was \$83,058* and ranked 22nd in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 10.4 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Hot Springs. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 54.4 percent of TPI (compared with 55.5 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 22.5 percent (compared with 25.9 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.1 percent (compared with 18.6 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 13.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Hot Springs increased from \$62,575* in 2000 to \$73,804* in 2001, an increase of 17.9 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 8.5 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$50,995* to the 2001 estimate was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
