



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Lubbock-Levelland (BEA-EA) [57099]**

Lubbock-Levelland is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2001 population of 412,247 ranked 127th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Lubbock-Levelland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,931. This PCPI ranked 151st in the United States and was 75 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Lubbock-Levelland was \$15,806 and ranked 131st in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Lubbock-Levelland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$9,453,132\*. This TPI ranked 130th in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Lubbock-Levelland was \$6,258,422\* and ranked 125th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 1.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Lubbock-Levelland. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 64.6 percent of TPI (compared with 67.5 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.0 percent (compared with 17.8 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.4 percent (compared with 14.6 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 0.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 1.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 3.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.6 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Lubbock-Levelland decreased from \$6,771,433\* in 2000 to \$6,751,560\* in 2001, a decrease of 0.3 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$4,655,275\* to the 2001 estimate was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
