



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001 Tulsa-Bartlesville (BEA-EA) [57170]**

Tulsa-Bartlesville is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2001 population of 1,260,930 ranked 60th in the nation.

### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Tulsa-Bartlesville had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,279. This PCPI ranked 44th in the United States and was 92 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 7.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Tulsa-Bartlesville was \$17,764 and ranked 60th in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Tulsa-Bartlesville had a total personal income (TPI) of \$35,658,258\*. This TPI ranked 56th in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Tulsa-Bartlesville was \$20,227,781\* and ranked 57th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 8.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tulsa-Bartlesville. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 68.7 percent of TPI (compared with 68.0 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.1 percent (compared with 18.6 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.3 percent (compared with 13.5 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 9.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent remained unchanged; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.1 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 5.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.4 percent.

### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Tulsa-Bartlesville increased from \$24,809,793\* in 2000 to \$27,183,191\* in 2001, an increase of 9.6 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$15,400,592\* to the 2001 estimate was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
