



## **BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 Tippecanoe , Indiana [18157]**

Tippecanoe is one of 92 counties in Indiana. It is part of the [Lafayette, IN \(MSA\)](#). Its 2002 population of 151,336 ranked 8th in the state.

### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Tippecanoe had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,080. This PCPI ranked 40th in the state and was 89 percent of the state average, \$28,058, and 81 percent of the national average, \$30,838. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.4 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.3 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Tippecanoe was \$17,263 and ranked 38th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Tippecanoe had a total personal income (TPI) of \$3,795,505\*. This TPI ranked 9th in the state and accounted for 2.2 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Tippecanoe was \$2,331,420\* and ranked 9th in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 2.9 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tippecanoe. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 69.7 percent of TPI (compared with 70.3 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.6 percent (compared with 18.6 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 11.7 percent (compared with 11.1 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 2.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 0.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.8 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 4.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.6 percent.

### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Tippecanoe increased from \$3,413,079\* in 2001 to \$3,504,240\* in 2002, an increase of 2.7 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 3.4 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$2,116,286\* to the 2002 estimate was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
