



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002

Yellow Medicine , Minnesota [27173]

Yellow Medicine is one of 87 counties in Minnesota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2002 population of 10,747 ranked 69th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Yellow Medicine had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$23,230. This PCPI ranked 72nd in the state and was 70 percent of the state average, \$33,283, and 75 percent of the national average, \$30,838. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.3 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.0 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Yellow Medicine was \$15,714 and ranked 67th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Yellow Medicine had a total personal income (TPI) of \$249,657*. This TPI ranked 69th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Yellow Medicine was \$182,239* and ranked 65th in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 0.6 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Yellow Medicine. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 55.3 percent of TPI (compared with 55.0 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.3 percent (compared with 24.4 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 24.4 percent (compared with 20.7 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 2.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 9.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.1 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 3.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Yellow Medicine increased from \$135,316* in 2001 to \$140,061* in 2002, an increase of 3.5 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 3.2 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$109,832* to the 2002 estimate was 2.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
