



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002

Missoula , Montana [30063]

Missoula is one of 56 counties in Montana. It is part of the [Missoula, MT \(MSA\)](#). Its 2002 population of 98,925 ranked 2nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Missoula had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,981. This PCPI ranked 4th in the state and was 108 percent of the state average, \$25,080, and 87 percent of the national average, \$30,838. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.6 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.6 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Missoula was \$17,312 and ranked 14th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Missoula had a total personal income (TPI) of \$2,669,139*. This TPI ranked 2nd in the state and accounted for 11.7 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Missoula was \$1,446,424* and ranked 3rd in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 4.2 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Missoula. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 68.0 percent of TPI (compared with 66.1 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.9 percent (compared with 19.4 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.1 percent (compared with 14.5 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 3.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.5 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 6.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Missoula increased from \$2,111,836* in 2001 to \$2,203,204* in 2002, an increase of 4.3 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.5 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$1,168,075* to the 2002 estimate was 6.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
