



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002

San Antonio (MSA) [41700]

San Antonio is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2002 population of 1,779,168 ranked 28th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 San Antonio had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,053. This PCPI ranked 171st in the United States and was 88 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI remained unchanged from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of San Antonio was \$17,742 and ranked 221st in the United States. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 San Antonio had a total personal income (TPI) of \$48,131,526*. This TPI ranked 35th in the United States. In 1992 the TPI of San Antonio was \$25,998,839* and ranked 36th in the United States. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 1.9 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of San Antonio. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 71.0 percent of TPI (compared with 68.5 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.6 percent (compared with 17.6 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.4 percent (compared with 13.9 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 2.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 5.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.7 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 6.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in San Antonio increased from \$36,756,983* in 2001 to \$37,592,185* in 2002, an increase of 2.3 percent. The 2001-2002 national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$19,752,703* to the 2002 estimate was 6.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.4 percent.
