



## **BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003**

### **Bloomington-Normal (MSA) [14060]**

Bloomington-Normal is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2003 population of 157,227 ranked 238th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2003 Bloomington-Normal had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$32,057. This PCPI ranked 78th in the United States and was 102 percent of the national average, \$31,530. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 7.4 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Bloomington-Normal was \$20,604 and ranked 110th in the United States. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.0 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2003 Bloomington-Normal had a total personal income (TPI) of \$5,040,209\*. This TPI ranked 207th in the United States. In 1993 the TPI of Bloomington-Normal was \$2,819,288\* and ranked 219th in the United States. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 8.5 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.1 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Bloomington-Normal. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 76.9 percent of TPI (compared with 72.6 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.8 percent (compared with 17.5 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 9.3 percent (compared with 9.9 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 10.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 1.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.0 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 6.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Bloomington-Normal increased from \$4,323,839\* in 2002 to \$4,734,910\* in 2003, an increase of 9.5 percent. The 2002-2003 national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$2,430,424\* to the 2003 estimate was 6.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.3 percent.
