



BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

Billings , North Dakota [38007]

Billings is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is part of the Dickinson, ND Micropolitan SA. Its 2003 population of 830 ranked 52nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Billings had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,696. This PCPI ranked 48th in the state and was 79 percent of the state average, \$28,712, and 72 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 23.3 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Billings was \$13,814 and ranked 48th in the state. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Billings had a total personal income (TPI) of \$18,838*. This TPI ranked 52nd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1993 the TPI of Billings was \$15,278* and ranked 52nd in the state. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 18.7 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 8.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Billings. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 60.1 percent of TPI (compared with 64.9 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 28.0 percent (compared with 24.2 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 11.8 percent (compared with 10.9 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 34.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 1.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.5 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 1.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Billings increased from \$9,973* in 2002 to \$13,392* in 2003, an increase of 34.3 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 12.2 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$13,653* to the 2003 estimate was - 0.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
