



BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

Turner , South Dakota [46125]

Turner is one of 66 counties in South Dakota. It is part of the [Sioux Falls, SD \(MSA\)](#). Its 2003 population of 8,562 ranked 21st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Turner had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$32,383. This PCPI ranked 10th in the state and was 111 percent of the state average, \$29,207, and 103 percent of the national average, \$31,530. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 17.8 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 8.0 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Turner was \$17,774 and ranked 27th in the state. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 6.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Turner had a total personal income (TPI) of \$277,261*. This TPI ranked 16th in the state and accounted for 1.2 percent of the state total. In 1993 the TPI of Turner was \$152,877* and ranked 18th in the state. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 17.7 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Turner. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 69.4 percent of TPI (compared with 62.2 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.9 percent (compared with 21.9 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.7 percent (compared with 15.9 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 22.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 11.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.2 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 7.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.8 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Turner increased from \$81,428* in 2002 to \$114,398* in 2003, an increase of 40.5 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 11.1 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$67,705* to the 2003 estimate was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
