



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004 Greeley , Kansas [20071]

Greeley is one of 105 counties in Kansas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 1,389 ranked 105th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Greeley had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,274. This PCPI ranked 49th in the state and was 82 percent of the state average, \$30,992, and 76 percent of the national average, \$33,157. The 2004 PCPI reflected a decrease of 11.5 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 4.0 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Greeley was \$28,952 and ranked 3rd in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was - 1.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Greeley had a total personal income (TPI) of \$35,105*. This TPI ranked 105th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Greeley was \$48,321* and ranked 103rd in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected a decrease of 11.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 4.3 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Greeley. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 62.5 percent of TPI (compared with 74.5 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 19.6 percent (compared with 14.8 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.9 percent (compared with 10.8 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings decreased 16.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 6.3 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings decreased on average 4.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 1.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Greeley decreased from \$29,568* in 2003 to \$25,576* in 2004, a decrease of 13.5 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$39,160* to the 2004 estimate was - 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
