



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Oklahoma City (MSA) [36420]

Oklahoma City is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2004 population of 1,140,289 ranked 47th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Oklahoma City had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$31,362. This PCPI ranked 121st in the United States and was 95 percent of the national average, \$33,157. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.5 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 national change was 5.2 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Oklahoma City was \$19,714 and ranked 181st in the United States. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Oklahoma City had a total personal income (TPI) of \$35,761,810*. This TPI ranked 48th in the United States. In 1994 the TPI of Oklahoma City was \$20,292,157* and ranked 52nd in the United States. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 9.4 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Oklahoma City. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 71.7 percent of TPI (compared with 69.8 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.3 percent (compared with 17.2 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.0 percent (compared with 13.0 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 10.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 9.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.7 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 6.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.8 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Oklahoma City increased from \$26,507,867* in 2003 to \$29,156,023* in 2004, an increase of 10.0 percent. The 2003-2004 national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$16,229,295* to the 2004 estimate was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.
