



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Cotton , Oklahoma [40033]

Cotton is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 6,388 ranked 66th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Cotton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,216. This PCPI ranked 18th in the state and was 89 percent of the state average, \$28,444, and 76 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 12.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.5 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Cotton was \$15,630 and ranked 35th in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Cotton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$161,083*. This TPI ranked 65th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Cotton was \$103,002* and ranked 67th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 12.2 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 8.0 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Cotton. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 67.7 percent of TPI (compared with 61.3 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 11.9 percent (compared with 16.9 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.4 percent (compared with 21.8 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 14.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 12.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.7 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 5.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Cotton increased from \$50,220* in 2003 to \$63,272* in 2004, an increase of 26.0 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 8.8 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$35,635* to the 2004 estimate was 5.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
