



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Providence , Rhode Island [44007]

Providence is one of 5 counties in Rhode Island. It is part of the [Providence-New Bedford-Fall River, RI-MA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2004 population of 636,605 ranked 1st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Providence had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$31,052. This PCPI ranked 5th in the state and was 90 percent of the state average, \$34,375, and 94 percent of the national average, \$33,157. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.0 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Providence was \$20,795 and ranked 5th in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Providence had a total personal income (TPI) of \$19,767,986*. This TPI ranked 1st in the state and accounted for 53.7 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Providence was \$12,533,809* and ranked 1st in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 3.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.0 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Providence. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 64.5 percent of TPI (compared with 62.6 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.3 percent (compared with 16.9 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 21.2 percent (compared with 20.5 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 5.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 6.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.7 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 5.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Providence increased from \$15,290,834* in 2003 to \$16,068,342* in 2004, an increase of 5.1 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$10,238,753* to the 2004 estimate was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
