



## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Nebraska [31000]**

The population of Nebraska in 2005 was 1,754,042. Its rank was 38th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Nebraska had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$32,882. This PCPI ranked 22nd in the United States and was 95 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.5 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Nebraska was \$21,730 and ranked 24th in the United States. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Nebraska had a total personal income (TPI) of \$57,677,168\*. This TPI ranked 36th in the United States. In 1995 the TPI of Nebraska was \$36,006,247\* and ranked 36th in the United States. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 4.1 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Nebraska. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 68.0 percent of TPI (compared with 66.6 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.0 percent (compared with 20.5 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.0 percent (compared with 12.9 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 3.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 5.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.0 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 5.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.7 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Nebraska increased from \$43,536,886\* in 2004 to \$45,115,949\* in 2005, an increase of 3.6 percent. The 2004-2005 national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$27,606,937\* to the 2005 estimate was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
