



BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006

Sioux , Nebraska [31165]

Sioux is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2006 population of 1,364 ranked 81st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Sioux had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,078. This PCPI ranked 91st in the state and was 47 percent of the state average, \$34,053, and 44 percent of the national average, \$36,794. The 2006 PCPI reflected a decrease of 19.9 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 3.7 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Sioux was \$12,301 and ranked 87th in the state. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.8 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Sioux had a total personal income (TPI) of \$21,931^{*}. This TPI ranked 81st in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1996 the TPI of Sioux was \$18,870^{*} and ranked 83rd in the state. The 2006 TPI reflected a decrease of 22.0 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 4.2 percent and the national change was 7.1 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was 1.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Sioux. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 52.8 percent of TPI (compared with 50.5 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 24.8 percent (compared with 34.5 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.5 percent (compared with 15.1 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings decreased 35.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 1.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.4 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings increased on average 2.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 1.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Sioux decreased from \$8,061^{*} in 2005 to \$1,000^{*} in 2006, a decrease of 87.6 percent. The 2005-2006 state change was 3.5 percent and the national change was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$4,768^{*} to the 2006 estimate was - 14.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
