



BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006

Oklahoma , Oklahoma [40109]

Oklahoma is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the [Oklahoma City, OK \(MSA\)](#). Its 2006 population of 692,677 ranked 1st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Oklahoma had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$40,239. This PCPI ranked 2nd in the state and was 123 percent of the state average, \$32,755, and 109 percent of the national average, \$36,794. The 2006 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.0 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 8.3 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Oklahoma was \$22,470 and ranked 4th in the state. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Oklahoma had a total personal income (TPI) of \$27,872,373*. This TPI ranked 1st in the state and accounted for 23.8 percent of the state total. In 1996 the TPI of Oklahoma was \$14,390,983* and ranked 1st in the state. The 2006 TPI reflected an increase of 11.2 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 9.5 percent and the national change was 7.1 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.9 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Oklahoma. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 69.7 percent of TPI (compared with 67.3 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.5 percent (compared with 19.0 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.9 percent (compared with 13.7 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings increased 10.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 14.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.6 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings increased on average 7.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Oklahoma increased from \$25,181,316* in 2005 to \$27,836,811* in 2006, an increase of 10.5 percent. The 2005-2006 state change was 8.8 percent and the national change was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$14,331,905* to the 2006 estimate was 6.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.0 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
