



BEARFACTS 1997 – 2007

Loup , Nebraska [31115]

Loup is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2007 population of 642 ranked 88th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Loup had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$8,579. This PCPI ranked 93rd in the state and was 24 percent of the state average, \$36,372, and 22 percent of the national average, \$38,615. The 2007 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.8 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 6.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1997 the PCPI of Loup was \$5,595 and ranked 92nd in the state. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Loup had a total personal income (TPI) of \$5,508*. This TPI ranked 93rd in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1997 the TPI of Loup was \$4,006* and ranked 92nd in the state. The 2007 TPI reflected an increase of 3.5 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 7.4 percent and the national change was 6.0 percent. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Loup. From 2006 to 2007 dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 15.2 percent. From 1997 to 2007 net earnings cannot be calculated; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 1.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Loup decreased from \$- 1,683* in 2006 to \$- 2,349* in 2007. The 2006-2007 state change was 6.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1997 estimate of \$- 1,938* to the 2007 estimate cannot be calculated. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
