



## **BEARFACTS 1997 – 2007**

### **Slope , North Dakota [38087]**

Slope is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2007 population of 658 ranked 53rd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2007 Slope had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$30,374. This PCPI ranked 45th in the state and was 84 percent of the state average, \$36,082, and 79 percent of the national average, \$38,615. The 2007 PCPI reflected an increase of 88.5 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 11.9 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1997 the PCPI of Slope was \$9,912 and ranked 53rd in the state. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 11.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2007 Slope had a total personal income (TPI) of \$19,986\*. This TPI ranked 53rd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1997 the TPI of Slope was \$7,890\* and ranked 53rd in the state. The 2007 TPI reflected an increase of 80.0 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 12.2 percent and the national change was 6.0 percent. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of TPI was 9.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Slope. In 2007 net earnings accounted for 64.0 percent of TPI (compared with 26.4 in 1997); dividends, interest, and rent were 19.4 percent (compared with 47.9 in 1997); and personal current transfer receipts were 16.6 percent (compared with 25.7 in 1997). From 2006 to 2007 net earnings increased 197.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 8.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.6 percent. From 1997 to 2007 net earnings increased on average 19.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.1 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Slope increased from \$3,917\* in 2006 to \$15,479\* in 2007, an increase of 295.2 percent. The 2006-2007 state change was 13.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1997 estimate of \$2,124\* to the 2007 estimate was 22.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.3 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
