



BEARFACTS 1997 – 2007

Harper , Oklahoma [40059]

Harper is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2007 population of 3,240 ranked 75th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Harper had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$34,841. This PCPI ranked 6th in the state and was 100 percent of the state average, \$34,997, and 90 percent of the national average, \$38,615. The 2007 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.4 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 6.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1997 the PCPI of Harper was \$24,249 and ranked 3rd in the state. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Harper had a total personal income (TPI) of \$112,885*. This TPI ranked 73rd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1997 the TPI of Harper was \$87,222* and ranked 72nd in the state. The 2007 TPI reflected an increase of 3.0 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 8.0 percent and the national change was 6.0 percent. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.1 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Harper. In 2007 net earnings accounted for 60.4 percent of TPI (compared with 55.5 in 1997); dividends, interest, and rent were 21.3 percent (compared with 28.0 in 1997); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.3 percent (compared with 16.4 in 1997). From 2006 to 2007 net earnings decreased 0.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 11.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.5 percent. From 1997 to 2007 net earnings increased on average 3.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Harper decreased from \$66,983* in 2006 to \$66,113* in 2007, a decrease of 1.3 percent. The 2006-2007 state change was 7.3 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1997 estimate of \$48,551* to the 2007 estimate was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.1 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
