



BEARFACTS 1997 – 2007

Castro , Texas [48069]

Castro is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2007 population of 7,185 ranked 186th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Castro had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$38,645. This PCPI ranked 20th in the state and was 104 percent of the state average, \$37,083, and 100 percent of the national average, \$38,615. The 2007 PCPI reflected an increase of 12.5 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 5.5 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1997 the PCPI of Castro was \$29,556 and ranked 9th in the state. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Castro had a total personal income (TPI) of \$277,666*. This TPI ranked 164th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1997 the TPI of Castro was \$248,593* and ranked 143rd in the state. The 2007 TPI reflected an increase of 10.6 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 7.6 percent and the national change was 6.0 percent. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of TPI was 1.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.6 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Castro. In 2007 net earnings accounted for 77.7 percent of TPI (compared with 80.8 in 1997); dividends, interest, and rent were 6.5 percent (compared with 8.8 in 1997); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.8 percent (compared with 10.4 in 1997). From 2006 to 2007 net earnings increased 11.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 5.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.2 percent. From 1997 to 2007 net earnings increased on average 0.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 1.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Castro increased from \$190,481* in 2006 to \$214,689* in 2007, an increase of 12.7 percent. The 2006-2007 state change was 7.6 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1997 estimate of \$206,066* to the 2007 estimate was 0.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
