



State BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Pennsylvania

The population of Pennsylvania in 1999 was 12,263,805. Its rank was 6th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Pennsylvania had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,937. This PCPI ranked 17th in the United States and was 100 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.6 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Pennsylvania was \$18,603 and ranked 17th in the United States. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Pennsylvania had a total personal income (TPI) of \$342,610,883*. This TPI ranked 6th in the United States. In 1989 the TPI of Pennsylvania was \$220,747,538* and ranked 6th in the United States. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 3.8 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Pennsylvania. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 66.4 percent of TPI (compared with 65.4 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.7 percent (compared with 20.4 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.9 percent (compared with 14.3 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 5.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.6 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 4.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Pennsylvania increased from \$241,836,043* in 1998 to \$253,991,772* in 1999, an increase of 5.0 percent. The 1998-1999 national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$162,184,227* to the 1999 estimate was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.
