



## State BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

### North Dakota

The population of North Dakota in 2000 was 641,183. Its rank was 47th in the nation.

#### PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 North Dakota had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,105. This PCPI ranked 38th in the United States and was 84 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.3 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of North Dakota was \$15,943 and ranked 39th in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 North Dakota had a total personal income (TPI) of \$16,096,687\*. This TPI ranked 49th in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of North Dakota was \$10,166,468\* and ranked 48th in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 7.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of North Dakota. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 64.6 percent of TPI (compared with 62.6 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.2 percent (compared with 21.9 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.3 percent (compared with 15.5 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 7.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 8.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.4 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.6 percent.

#### EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in North Dakota increased from \$11,494,913\* in 1999 to \$12,321,985\* in 2000, an increase of 7.2 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$7,464,920\* to the 2000 estimate was 5.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
