



## State BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001 Arizona

The population of Arizona in 2001 was 5,303,632. Its rank was 20th in the nation.

### PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Arizona had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,181. This PCPI ranked 37th in the United States and was 86 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.0 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Arizona was \$17,260 and ranked 36th in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

### TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Arizona had a total personal income (TPI) of \$138,853,800\*. This TPI ranked 23rd in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Arizona was \$65,389,779\* and ranked 25th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 4.7 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

### COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Arizona. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 67.7 percent of TPI (compared with 63.5 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.3 percent (compared with 22.3 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.0 percent (compared with 14.2 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 4.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent remained unchanged; and personal current transfer receipts increased 13.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 8.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.7 percent.

### EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Arizona increased from \$100,633,210\* in 2000 to \$105,085,189\* in 2001, an increase of 4.4 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$46,787,447\* to the 2001 estimate was 8.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
