- \* April exports of goods and services (\$252.6 billion) were the highest on record.
  - \* April exports of goods (\$176.1 billion) were the highest on record.
  - \* April exports of services (\$76.5 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April imports of services (\$55.9 billion) were the highest on record.

## Goods (Census Basis, seasonally adjusted)

#### Exports

- \* April exports of goods (\$174.6 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April exports of industrial supplies and materials (\$69.6 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April exports of foods, feeds, and beverages (\$17.5 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April exports of capital goods (\$47.5 billion) were the highest since March 2019 (\$48.0 billion).
- \* April petroleum exports (\$27.2 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April non-petroleum exports (\$147.4 billion) were the highest on record.

#### **Imports**

- \* April imports of foods, feeds, and beverages (\$18.3 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April imports of automotive vehicles, parts, and engines (\$33.7 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April petroleum imports (\$25.2 billion) were the highest since October 2014 (\$25.7 billion).

# Real Dollar Basis (Chained 2012 Dollars, seasonally adjusted)

## **Exports**

\* April real dollar exports of goods (\$155.0 billion) were the highest on record.

# Imports

\* April real dollar imports of foods, feeds, and beverages (\$14.7 billion) were the highest on record.

# Country and Other Highlights (Census Basis, not seasonally adjusted)

### Balance

- \* The April surplus with South and Central America (\$7.6 billion) was the highest on record.
- \* The April deficit with South Korea (\$4.1 billion) was the highest on record.

#### Exports

- April exports to South and Central America (\$20.0 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April exports to the United Kingdom (\$6.6 billion) were the highest since March 2018 (\$6.8 billion).

# Imports

- \* April imports from South Korea (\$9.9 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* April imports from India (\$7.7 billion) were the highest on record.
- \* The April import average price per barrel of crude oil (\$94.99) was the highest since August 2014 (\$96.34).
