



Outdoor Recreation Satellite Account, U.S. and States, 2021


New statistics for 2021; 2017–2020 updated

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis released statistics today measuring the outdoor recreation economy for the nation, all 50 states, and the District of Columbia. The new U.S. data show that the outdoor recreation economy accounted for 1.9 percent (\$454.0 billion) of current-dollar gross domestic product (GDP) for the nation in 2021 (national table 3). At the state level, value added for outdoor recreation as a share of state GDP ranged from 4.8 percent in Hawaii to 1.3 percent in New York and Connecticut. The share was 0.9 percent in the District of Columbia.





Inflation-adjusted ("real") GDP for the outdoor recreation economy increased 18.9 percent in 2021, compared with a 5.9 percent increase for the overall U.S. economy, reflecting a rebound in outdoor recreation after the decrease of 21.6 percent in 2020. Real gross output for the outdoor recreation economy increased 21.7 percent, while outdoor recreation compensation increased 16.2 percent and employment increased 13.1 percent.





Across all 50 states and the District of Columbia outdoor recreation employment increased in 2021, ranging from 23.4 percent in Hawaii to 6.9 percent in Michigan.



Outdoor recreation by activity

Outdoor recreation activities fall into three general categories: conventional activities (such as bicycling, boating, hiking, and hunting), other activities (such as gardening and outdoor concerts), and supporting activities (such as construction, travel and tourism, local trips, and government expenditures).


In 2021, conventional outdoor recreation accounted for 35.1 percent of U.S. outdoor recreation value added, compared with 40.1 percent in 2020. Other outdoor recreation accounted for 17.6 percent of value added in 2021, compared with 17.5 percent in 2020. Supporting activities accounted for the remaining 47.3 percent of value added in 2021, compared with 42.4 percent in 2020. Supporting activities, particularly travel and tourism-related activities, rebounded in 2021 as COVID–19 restrictions eased and consumers traveled more and increased spending on transportation, hotels, and restaurants.



Additional highlights for value added by activity for 2021 are as follows:

- **Boating/fishing** was the largest conventional activity for the nation at \$27.3 billion in currentdollar value added and was the largest conventional activity in 27 states and the District of Columbia. The largest contributors were Florida (\$4.0 billion), California (\$2.3 billion), and Texas (\$2.0 billion) (state table 2).
- **RVing** was the second-largest conventional activity for the nation at \$25.1 billion in currentdollar value added and was the largest conventional activity in 15 states. The largest contributors were Indiana (\$5.4 billion), Texas (\$2.2 billion), and California (\$2.0 billion).
- **Hunting/shooting/trapping** was the third-largest conventional activity for the nation at \$10.8 billion in current-dollar value added and was the largest conventional activity in two states. The largest contributors were Texas (\$1.2 billion), California (\$763.8 million), and Georgia (\$555.2 million).
- Snow activities for the nation was \$5.2 billion in current-dollar value added and was the largest conventional activity in four states. The largest contributors were Colorado (\$1.3 billion), Utah (\$519.4 million), and California (\$505.7 million).





Outdoor recreation by industry


The outdoor recreation by industry data show the contributions of industries to the outdoor recreation economy, including their impact on value added, gross output, employment, and compensation.

For the nation, the **retail trade** industry group was the largest contributor to U.S. outdoor recreation value added in 2021, accounting for \$119.9 billion (national table 6). At the state level, retail trade was the largest contributor to outdoor recreation value added in 33 states. The leading contributors were California (\$13.7 billion), Texas (\$10.4 billion), and Florida (\$10.2 billion) (state table 3).

Additional highlights for value added by industry for 2021 are as follows:

- Arts, entertainment, recreation, accommodation, and food services was the second-largest industry group for the nation at \$111.6 billion in current-dollar value added and was the largest industry group in 15 states and the District of Columbia. The largest contributors were California (\$15.9 billion), Florida (\$14.7 billion), and New York (\$8.2 billion).
- **Manufacturing** was the third-largest industry group for the nation at \$61.8 billion in currentdollar value added and was the largest industry group in two states. The largest contributors were Texas (\$7.6 billion), Indiana (\$7.5 billion), and California (\$6.2 billion).





Updates for 2017–2020

Today's release also reflects updated statistics for 2017–2020. At the national level, gross output, value added, employment, and compensation now incorporate the results of the 2022 annual update of the National Economic Accounts, which includes the National Income and Product Accounts and the Industry Economic Accounts. The state statistics now reflect the updated national data as well as the 2022 annual update of the Regional Economic Accounts and newly available and revised regional source data.

Definitions

Gross domestic product (GDP) or value added is the value of the goods and services produced by the nation's economy less the value of the goods and services used up in production. GDP is also equal to the sum of personal consumption expenditures, gross private domestic investment, net exports of goods and services, and government consumption expenditures and gross investment.

Gross output is the value of the goods and services produced by the nation's economy. It is principally measured using industry sales or receipts, including sales to final users (GDP) and sales to other industries.

Current-dollar estimates are valued in the prices of the period when the transactions occurred—that is, at "market

value." Also referred to as "nominal estimates" or as "current-price estimates."

Chained-dollar estimates are calculated by taking the current-dollar level of a series in the base period and multiplying it by the change in the chained-type quantity index number for the series since the base period. Chained-dollar estimates correctly show growth rates for a series but are not additive in periods other than the base period.

ORSA employment consists of all full-time, part-time, and temporary wage-and-salary jobs in which the workers are engaged in the production of outdoor recreation goods and services. Self-employed individuals are excluded from employment totals.

ORSA compensation consists of the pay to employees (including wages and salaries and benefits such as employer contributions to pension and health funds) in return for their outdoor recreation-related work during a given year. Pay to the self-employed is excluded from compensation but included in value added.

ORSA value added (also referred to as GDP) consists of the value of outdoor recreation goods and services produced less the value of expenses incurred for their production. The activity of self-employed individuals is included in value added.

Geography of outdoor recreation

Outdoor recreation is measured by place of production, not residence of consumer. The value of manufactured goods, such as boats, is assigned to the state where they are produced, even if the goods are not ultimately used there. Services, such as sailing lessons, are assigned to the location where they are consumed. The value of services provided by retailers, such as boat dealers, is also assigned to the location of sale. The services of retailers (known as trade margins) are not measured by sales but are most akin to sales less the cost of goods sold. The production of imported goods is excluded from ORSA, but the value of the services of retailers selling the imported goods is included.

Outdoor recreation spending and production are allocated to states by applying state-level data to detailed, underlying national values. The underlying estimates are distributed to states before aggregation to publication levels to provide the most accurate state values possible. Statistics are primarily based on time-series data generated from the Economic Census and Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages. Additional government and nongovernment data sources are used to supplement the census data and to refine and evaluate the statistics.
