


Local Area Personal Income: Mideast Region, 2010

- The Mideast region accounted for 18 percent of the nation's personal income in 2010. Mideast's per capita personal income, \$47,122, was 118 percent of the national average, \$39,937.



In the Mideast region in 2010:

- Personal income grew in 177 of 178 counties. The largest growth occurred in Clarion County, Pennsylvania (9.4 percent), while the largest contraction occurred in Columbia County, Pennsylvania (-0.5 percent).
- Net earnings comprised 66 percent of personal income, while property income contributed 16 percent and transfer receipts made up 18 percent.
- Per capita personal income increased in 177 of 178 counties. New York County, New York (Manhattan) had the highest per capita personal income at \$111,386, while Forest County, Pennsylvania had the lowest per capita personal income at \$22,736.
