


Local Area Personal Income: New England Region, 2010

- The New England region accounted for 6 percent of the nation's personal income in 2010. New England's per capita personal income, \$48,840, was 122 percent of the national average, \$39,937.



In the New England region in 2010:

- Personal income grew in 66 of 67 counties. The largest growth occurred in Nantucket County, Massachusetts (8.7 percent), while the largest contraction occurred in Aroostook County, Maine (-0.2 percent).
- Net earnings comprised 66 percent of personal income, while property income contributed 17 percent and transfer receipts made up 17 percent.
- Per capita personal income increased in 66 of 67 counties. Nantucket County, Massachusetts had the highest per capita personal income at \$73,654, while Essex County, Vermont had the lowest per capita personal income at \$25,013.
