


## Local Area Personal Income: Southeast Region, 2010

- The Southeast region accounted for 23 percent of the nation's personal income in 2010. Southeast's per capita personal income, \$36,108, was 90 percent of the national average, \$39,937.



In the Southeast region in 2010:

- Personal income grew in 990 of 1,035 counties. The largest growth occurred in Issaquena County, Mississippi (17.4 percent), while the largest contraction occurred in Hickman County, Kentucky (-9.9 percent).
- Net earnings comprised 62 percent of personal income, while property income contributed 17 percent and transfer receipts made up 21 percent.
- Per capita personal income increased in 990 of 1,035 counties. Arlington County, Virginia had the highest per capita personal income at \$79,967, while Telfair County, Georgia had the lowest per capita personal income at \$16,614.
